



Scripture Lessons for October 29, 2023

PROVERBS 20:5-11

⁵The purposes in the human mind are like deep water, but the intelligent will draw them out.
⁶Many proclaim themselves loyal, but who can find one worthy of trust?
⁷The righteous walk in integrity— happy are the children who follow them!
⁸A king who sits on the throne of judgment winnows all evil with his eyes.
⁹Who can say, "I have made my heart clean; I am pure from my sin"?
¹⁰Diverse weights and diverse measures are both alike an abomination to the LORD.
¹¹Even children make themselves known by their acts, by whether what they do is pure and right.

1ST THESSALONIANS 2:1-8

You yourselves know, brothers and sisters, that our coming to you was not in vain, ²but though we had already suffered and been shamefully mistreated at Philippi, as you know, we had courage in our God to declare to you the gospel of God in spite of great opposition. ³For our appeal does not spring from deceit or impure motives or trickery, ⁴but just as we have been approved by God to be entrusted with the message of the gospel, even so we speak, not to please mortals, but to please God who tests our hearts. ⁵As you know and as God is our witness, we never came with words of flattery or with a pretext for greed; ⁶nor did we seek praise from mortals, whether from you or from others,

⁷though we might have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nurse tenderly caring for her own children. ⁸So deeply do we care for you that we are determined to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you have become very dear to us.
